3 ways to maximize your Tower Garden experience

1. Plan what to grow

Your seedling starter kit comes with seeds for growing lettuces, tomatoes, basil and cucumber. Especially if you are a beginning gardener, we suggest you start with lettuce and basil. (We'll be sending along a great basil recipe in a later email!) Tower Garden supports many other plants. View a list of other things you can grow.

You'll want to plan to put plants with heavy produce (e.g., eggplant, tomatoes) and plants that climb (e.g., green beans) toward the bottom of your Tower. Lettuces and herbs work well toward the top. Read the plant-specific Growing Guides for more guidance.



When your Tower Garden arrives, the first step is to start your seeds. Watch this video to learn how »

2. Find an optimum placement

- Level ground. Tower Garden must be level to work.
- Sun exposure. Tower Garden will ideally need 5-6 hours of sun per day. In a hot, dry
 climate, some shade will be helpful. If you need to move your Tower Garden to ensure it
 has enough sun during the day, consider purchasing a dolly designed to fit your Tower
 Garden from the online store.
- Water. You will need to access water to fill and refill your reservoir.
- Electricity. Direct access from pump to outlet is ideal. Exercise proper safety if using an extension cord.

3. Maintain your Tower Garden

While Tower Garden doesn't need nearly as much attention as a traditional garden, a little maintenance is essential for great results. Your next Tower Garden email will go into those details. In the meantime, your Growing Guide explains key tasks.

Quick Tip

Some plants need additional support to grow properly. Consider adding a tomato cage to your Tower if you are growing tomatoes or other heavier plants.

It's easy to maintain

The Tower Garden is low-maintenance, but it does require occasional attention. Once you transfer your seedlings to the Tower Garden, it's important to properly maintain your system as described in the Tower Garden Growing Guide:

- Check the water level weekly. When plants become large, check it twice a week.
- · Check the pH twice a week.
- Keep the shower cap holes clean and clear of debris.
- Keep roots away from the pump. You'll be amazed how quickly the roots of your plants grow. You can cut them in half if you need to without impacting the growth of your plants.
- Clean the pump filter monthly.
- If the sun shines unevenly on your Tower Garden, rotate the reservoir lid one quarter turn once a day.

One of Tower Garden's key advantages to traditional gardening is that your plants will grow faster than in soil. Get ready to enjoy your home-grown produce!

Prepare for the harvest

Lettuces and herbs will be ready for harvest first, and they will allow you to re-harvest them several times. By removing only a portion of the plants' leaves at a time, you can increase your garden's yield.

For lettuces, you may choose to harvest the entire plant. It's therefore important to have replacement seedlings ready. Order your seedling starter kit now, or pick up fresh seedlings at your favorite local garden center or at livingtowerseedlings.com.

Note: It's important to check your plants at least twice a week during the harvest season so your produce does not get overripe.



Basil Pesto Recipe



Basil grows rapidly and will soon be abundant. Basil pesto is a perfect staple for pizza, pastas, grilled breads and tomatoes. Here's a great pesto recipe from a fellow Tower Gardener.

- 1/4 cup toasted cashews or walnuts (dry skillet 4-5 minutes)
- 4 large cloves of garlic (toast skin on for 7 minutes)
- 2 cups packed basil
- 7 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil
- 1/2-3/4 cup olive oil
- 1 1/2 cup grated Parmesan or pecorino

Place all ingredients (except cheese) in a food processor and process until smooth. Transfer to small bowl and stir in cheese. Keeps refrigerated up to 3 days.
